Autumn Term One in Year 6



## English

We will be spending the first four weeks of the Autumn term with a grammar focus. We are following the Place Value of Punctuation and Grammar. Following this, we will delve into the wonderful world of Macbeth. Children will:

- Complete character descriptions on the three witches
- Write a diary entry in role as Macbeth.

- harmful microorganisms
- Carl Linnaeus and his development of his classification system

# Termly Learning

## Religious Education

In RE we will look at our Class Saint.

We also learn about the story of the people of God and followers of Christ.

Each term, children will work together to plan, lead and present a Collective Worship for the class. As the children are making their Confirmation this year, it is important that they try and join us for 9am Sunday Mass to read or sing in the choir. If they can't attend, we ask that they try and attend mass on one of the other times.



## Geography

In Geography, the children will be studying the topic:

Why does population change?

- Explore birth and death rates
- Discuss social economic and environmental push and pull factors
- Field work
- Learning about the population in Britain and its impact

Children will be using different mediums to produce art work around the theme of wildlife. They will sketch, paint, print and use clay.

# Homework at CTK

At CTK we believe that regular homework is important as it gives children the opportunity to practice at home the tasks covered in class and also helps children work towards improving important skills.

Research shows that homework also benefits factual knowledge, self-discipline, attitudes to learning and problem-solving skills.

## Reading

From Nursery we encourage all parents to read to their child because when children are exposed to a wide range of words it helps them to build their own vocabulary and improve their understanding as they listen.

In Reception children will receive a weekly reading book linked to their phonics knowledge and the sounds which they are taught each week. As the children move into Year 1 and Year 2 children will be given a reading book based on their phonic and word knowledge.



In Year 3 - 6 children are supported to independently choose their own weekly reading book from the KS2 Reading Scheme which is organised and sequenced by end of year expectations. We ask that parents hear their child read at least four times a week and sign their child's reading diary each time

## Spellings

Spelling along with vocabulary and phonics are a critical foundational skills that helps your child with reading fluency and reading comprehension.

- Children are set weekly spellings.
- Year 1 & 2 pupils weekly spellings are set in accordance with their phonic knowledge and weekly phonic lessons.
- Year 3 - Year 6 pupils weekly spellings are set according to individual ability and National Curriculum expectations using the programme Spelling Shed. These spellings also link to the children's weekly spelling lesson.

### MATHS Flex

**Reception, Year 1 and Year 2**

Weekly Homework is set on Doodle Maths

We encourage children to complete their Doodle Maths tasks for 10 minutes every day, 5 days a week. \*On average, a question should take 17 seconds to answer.

**Year 3 - \*Year 6**

Weekly Homework is set on Maths Flex

Maths Flex's quickly identifies the best practice session for each individual pupil. For a child working towards expectations, it serves them up pre-requisite learning and intervention, and for those exceeding expectations it delivers stretch activities.

## ARITHMETIC & FLUENCY

Mathematical fluency skills helps pupils to think faster and more clearly, giving them the energy, attention and focus to tackle complex problem-solving and reasoning questions.

In KS2 children have access to TT Rockstars where they can practice and apply their Times Table knowledge.

Children in Year 2 - 6 are also encouraged to complete their 10 minute weekly arithmetic practice in the work book provided.



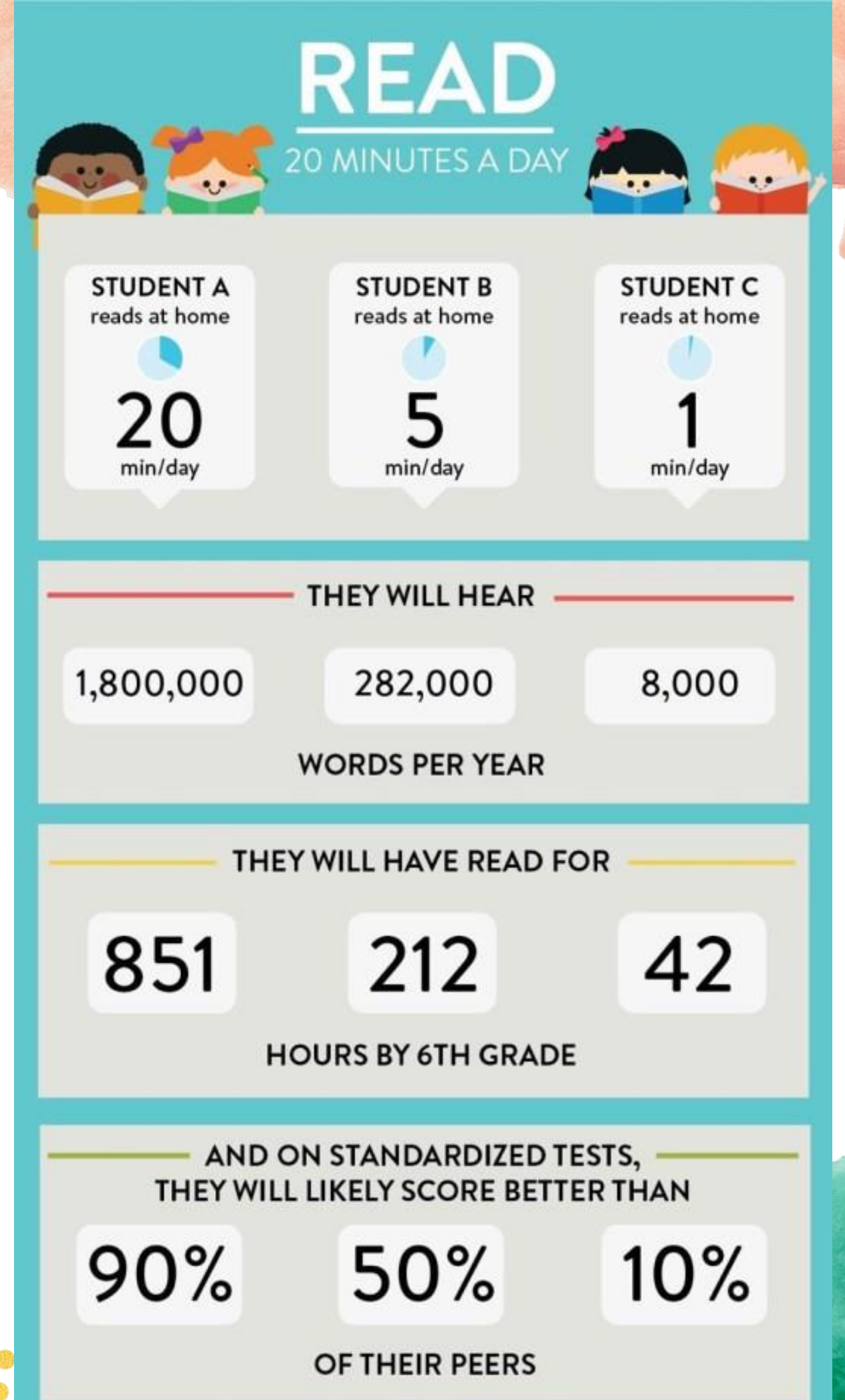
\*Year 6 - homework set is inline with end of key stage 2 expectations and support in preparation for end of KS 2 statutory testing.

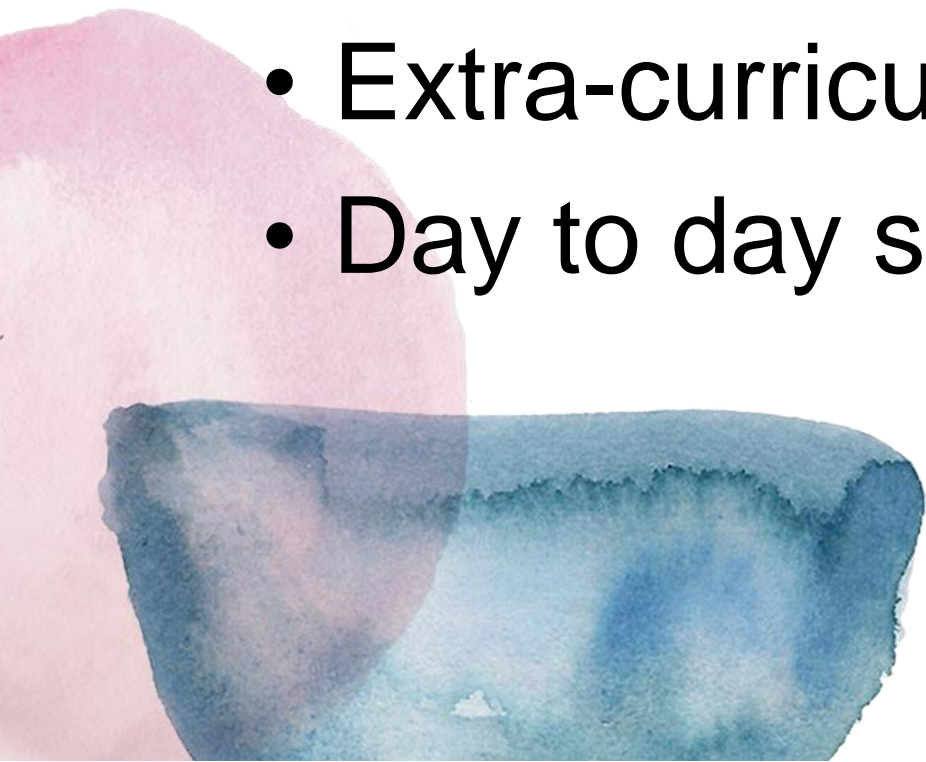
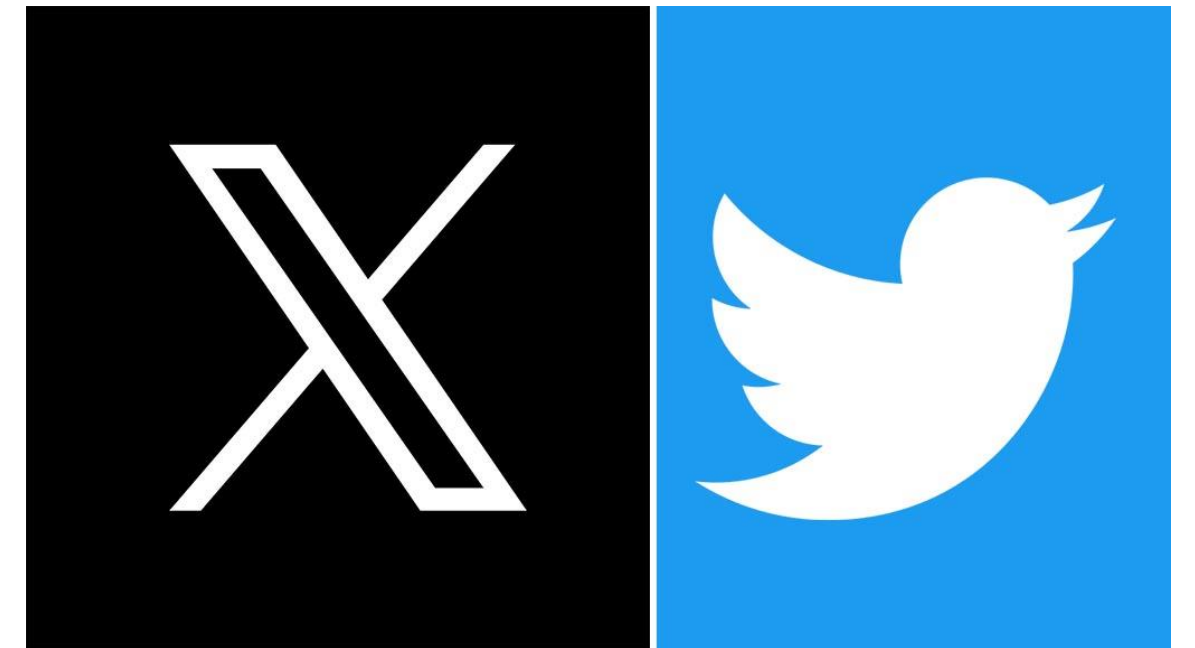

# Termly Assessments

## Year 1 – Year 6

At the end of each term, all children will complete a diagnostic test in **Reading, English grammar, punctuation and spelling (GPS) and Maths** which is in line with their current curriculum of study, for example a year 2 child who is being taught the year 2 curriculum would be asked to answer questions based on that curriculum.

The diagnostic tests supports the evaluation of how well children are learning and retaining the information taught. This highlights any misconceptions and gaps then enables teachers to plan the correct support and intervention for the class or individual pupils.

The results of the termly tests, are an indicator, to both teachers and parents, of which areas each child excels in and which areas they require further support in. The results will always be shared with parents in the child's termly progress report.

# Termly Reports

Termly reports regarding your child's progress and attainment will be sent home towards the end of each term.

You will also have the opportunity to speak to your child's class teacher during each term in a planned parent consultation meeting - more information will be shared during the half term.

# Year 6 - SATs

## Statutory Testing

At the end of Year 6, children will sit tests in:

Date	Test paper
Monday 12 <sup>th</sup> May 2025	Spelling and Grammar (x2 papers)
Tuesday 13 <sup>th</sup> May 2025	Reading (x1 paper)
Wednesday 14 <sup>th</sup> May 2025	Arithmetic and Reasoning (x2 papers)
Thursday 15 <sup>th</sup> May 2025	Reasoning (x1 paper)

These tests will be both set and marked externally, and the results will be used to measure your child's progress and the school's performance.

# Year 6 - SATs

## Statutory Testing

### GPS

The grammar, punctuation and spelling test will consist of two parts:

- **Grammar and punctuation paper** requiring short answers (**45 minutes**)
  - **Spelling test of 20 words** (approx. **15 minutes**)

### READING

Your child will have **one hour**, including reading time, to complete the test.  
*No prompts are allowed from an adult.*

### Maths

Children will sit three papers in maths:

- Paper 1: **arithmetic (30 minutes)**
- Papers 2 and 3: **mathematical fluency, solving problems and reasoning (40 minutes** per paper)

### Writing

Teacher Assessed using evidence gathered from across the spring and summer term from a range of pupils' books and moderated within the MAC and possibly externally.

# Plas Dol-y-Moch

Situated in the Snowdonia National Park between the mountain and the sea, Plas Dol-y-Moch is a large 17th century country house set in gardens and woodlands in the Vale of Ffestiniog, and it has been **Coventry's outdoor education centre since 1966.**

It is an ideal base for adventure activities and field work with all activities close at hand and easily reached in the Centre's fleet of four minibuses. **All tutorial staff are highly qualified teachers of outdoor education and work closely with Coventry schools to design and deliver courses.**

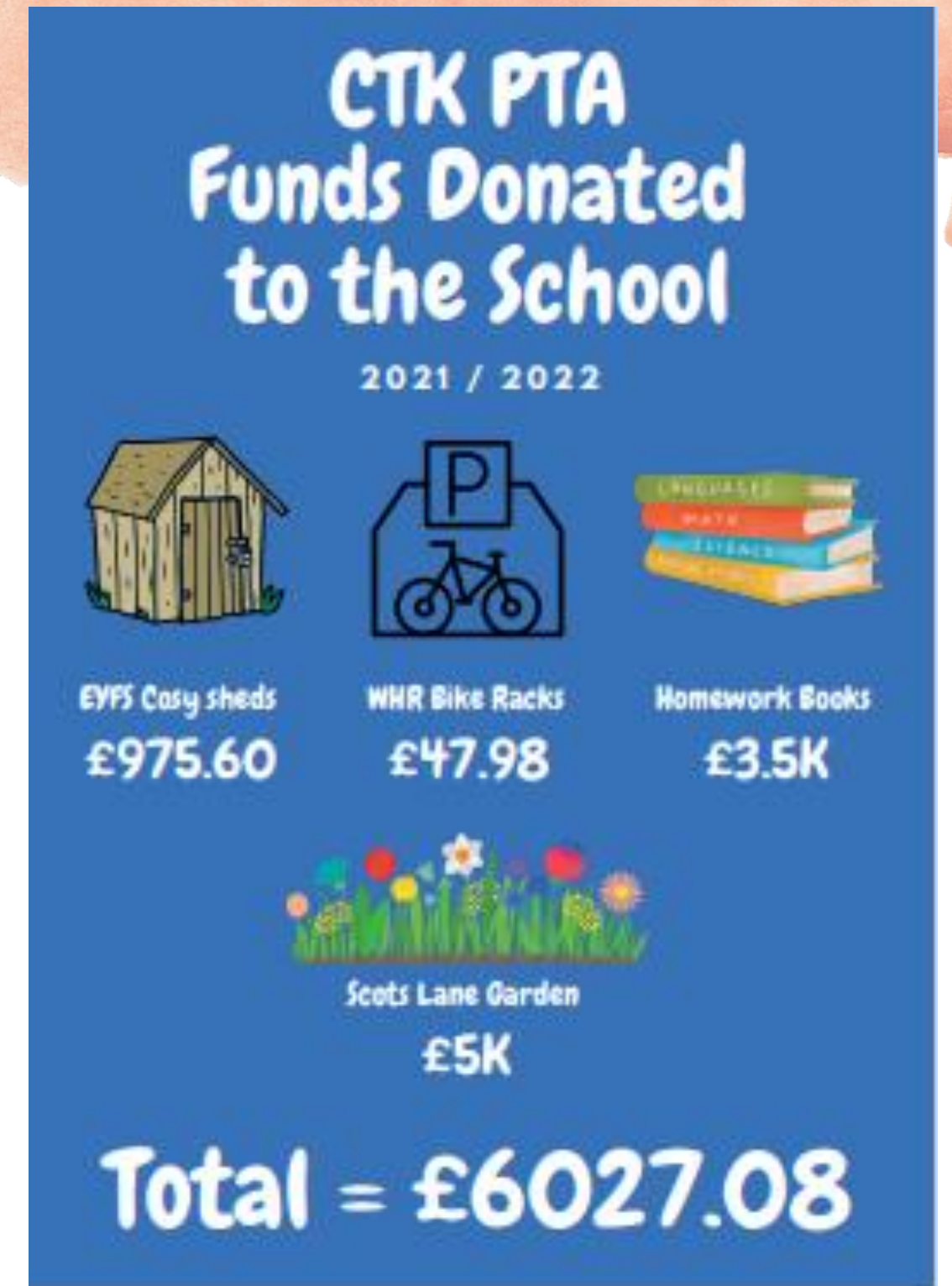

The Department for Education has recently published a number of changes to issuing penalty notices for leave in term time these will come into effect from the 19th August 2024.

The changes to the law are introduced through the Education (Penalty Notices) England - Regulations 2024. As these changes are significant, we would urge all parents/carers to take notice of them and the implications of pupils taking unauthorised absence for holidays.

## **New two-penalty notice limit in a three-year period.**

The three-year rolling period starts for parents when the first penalty notice is issued to them after the 19 August 2024.

The first Penalty Notice for leave in term time will increase to £160 per parent per child but can be reduced to £80 per parent per child if paid within 21 days.

If a second penalty notice is issued within three years of the first penalty notice, then this will be at a fixed rate of £160 per parent per child, with no reduction for early payment.

A third penalty notice cannot be issued within the three-year period; therefore, the county council will deal with any further unauthorised leave through prosecution in the Magistrates Court. If the parent is found guilty, the potential fine is up to £2500.

Please be reminded, school does not benefit from the fine and the money stays with Coventry City Council.
