

The school has benefitted from £11,693 of donations.







I was able to check in about any questions I had and it was a good opportunity to share that I was a little anxious about how he might be when settling as he hadn't been to a previous setting/away from family members before.

My daughter said she liked meeting her new teachers, that they were really nice. The little gifts of bubbles and 'magic' for under the pillow to take away nerves were such a lovely touch and really helped ___ feel less anxious and showed the nurture and care of the staff to go to that effort to plan something so thoughtful.

It was a great way for the child and yourself as a parent to get a feel of the school in a friendly environment.

Get Ready For Nursery

It is nearly time to start Nursery. Here are some things you can practise at home to help you get ready for Nursery.



Eating and Drinking

Sit down while eating food.
Pour water from a jug.
Drink from a straw.

Mark Making and Writing

Make marks on paper.
Practice holding a pencil.
Trace lines and colour pictures in

Number and Shape

Sing number songs.
Count some objects.
Play counting games.

Reading

Begin to recognise my name.
Talk about pictures in books.

Uniform

Purchase a uniform, including shoes that are easy for your child to take off and put on by themselves.
Label everything including shoes, ties, book bags, etc.

Routine

Practise putting their uniform on. Encourage them to become more independent, putting their own shoes on.
Have a good night time routine so they are feeling ready for Nursery.



Top Tips For Parents and Carers

Relationships

If you have any questions or queries then ask the Nursery staff. We are here to help.

Information/Collection

Keep school records up to date. This includes things like changes of address, telephone numbers, medical information and people who can collect your child. If someone else is picking up your child then tell your child and inform the school.

Talking About Nursery

Talk about Nursery as a positive experience. Prior to starting Nursery walk or drive past the building to make it familiar to your child.

Put on my shoes and socks.
Get dressed by myself.
Put on my coat and do up my zip and buttons.

Speaking and Listening

Describe and make observations about what I see.
Ask questions.
Share thoughts and ideas.
Listen to stories.
Sing rhymes and songs.

Get Ready For School

It is nearly time to start school. Here are some things you can practise at home to help you get ready for school.

Eating and Drinking

Use a knife, fork and spoon.
Open a lunch box.
Open packets and wrappers.

Mark Making and Writing

Hold my pencil correctly.
Make purposeful marks.
Write my name.

Number and Shape

Say numbers from 0-20.
Recognise some numbers.
Count some objects.
Name and find shapes.

Reading

Recognise my name to help me find my drawer and coat peg.
Talk about pictures in books.
Recognise some letter sounds as well as names of letters.

Uniform

Purchase a uniform, including shoes that are easy for your child to take off and put on by themselves.

Label everything including shoes, ties, book bags, etc.

Routine

Establish a school day morning routine that includes breakfast, getting washed and dressed. Establish an evening routine too, such as homework time and packing your school bag.
Give your child some responsibility to organise themselves.





- A charcoal grey/black trousers or skirt. All of which must be no shorter than just above the knee
- A pair of grey/white socks or navy blue/ grey tights.
- If children wish to wear cycling shorts under their skirt for privacy reasons then they must be navy or black.

Summer term 1 & 2 Autumn term 1

- A white polo shirt with/ without the school logo.
