Safeguarding at CTK

Whether it's sunny days at the beach or fun in the paddling pool, children are naturally drawn to water. But with excitement comes risk. This guide brings together 10 clear, practical tips to help parents and educators protect children around water - whether that's at home, on school trips or on holiday.

Backed by the Royal Life Saving Society UK, the advice includes knowing what beach flags mean, avoiding inflatables in open water, and learning to 'float and call' in an emergency. With a focus on prevention and supervision, this guide is a must-read for summer safety and beyond.

10 Top Tips for Parents and Educators

STAYING SAFE AROUND WATER

Enjoying time in, on, and around water plays a vital role in a young person's overall development, offering a healthy and exhilarating way to have fun. This guide outlines essential safety advice, based on the Royal Life Saving Society UK's Water Safety Code, to help ensure children can enjoy swimming and similar activities safely and responsibly.

- STICK TO LIFEGUARDED AREAS**
It's never preferable to enter unpatrolled bodies of water, e.g. open lakes or rivers. Instead, it's considered best practice to accompany children to places with lifeguards, as they are trained to respond quickly to emergencies and provide first aid when needed.
- LEARN SIGNS AND FLAGS**
When going to a new environment, it's important to research the local area and make a note of any safety signs before entering the water. If visiting the seaside, most local children are aware of signs, but it's worth reminding them to be aware of any signs they see when they go to the sea.
- STOP AND THINK**
Young people should be cautious before entering water, as it's difficult to know what hazards could be underneath. Use the water use safety code and encourage children to ask themselves questions such as: 'Is the water too deep or too shallow?' 'Are there currents, tides, or under-water objects?' Make sure children have never to enter water from a height, or what turns before could create serious injuries.
- CONSIDER WATER TEMPERATURE**
Even on hot days, water can be deceptively cold. Inexpensive water toys, such as inflatable rings and inner tubes, are not designed to be used in the cold. It's advisable only to use them in warm water. If you're unsure, it's best to avoid them. Inflatable toys should be used in managed swimming pools, where they're used in more controlled and supervised environments.
- INFLATABLE SAFETY**
Although inflatable toys are fun, they can be dangerous. They can be used in open water, where they can become a hazard. They should only be used in managed swimming pools, where they're used in more controlled and supervised environments.
- SUPERVISION IS KEY**
For young children, and particularly those under the age of five, it's important for them to be supervised at home, outside and at the pool at all times. It's essential for parents and guardians to understand that young children can drown quickly and silently. Therefore, anyone supervising them must remain vigilant and be able to respond to an emergency.
- DON'T GO TOO FAR**
When swimming, especially in open water, it's best to swim closer to the shore and in shallow water. There's a risk of drowning in deep water, and in the case of children, the beach, water provided to them, will also have a risk of drowning to avoid and get out of the water safely.
- KEEP POOLS AND TUBS DRAINED**
For parents of young children, a simple way to protect them from the risk of drowning is to ensure that pools and bathtubs are fully drained after use and turning them over, returning lids to their place and making sure that any water that has been used is fully drained from the tub.
- FLOAT AND CALL 999**
If a child gets into difficulty in the water, they should float on their back, they should call for help. If a young person sees someone that is in trouble, they should not try to help immediately. They should call 999 and let them know their location. Children should never enter the water to attempt a rescue or retrieve belongings.
- TEACH WATER SAFETY**
Beyond swimming lessons, children should be encouraged to follow the water safety code. It's also important to ensure that children are aware of the water safety code. The Royal Life Saving Society UK provides a range of resources to help with this. Children should never enter the water to attempt a rescue or retrieve belongings.

As a school, we have a duty to carefully monitor the attendance of all children to ensure they are accessing their education and reaching their full potential

Last week, alongside your child's annual school report, you will have received an attendance letter via email. This letter will confirm whether your child has met the government's statutory attendance target of 95% for this school year. If your child has not met this target, then you would have received a letter providing a breakdown of their absences. This will show the difference between:

Authorised Absences – absences that have been approved by school, such as illness (with appropriate evidence) or medical appointments.

Unauthorised Absences – absences that have not been approved by school, including holidays taken during term time without permission or unexplained absences.

We would also like to remind families that a child is considered a Persistent Absentee if their attendance falls below 90% across the school year.

If your child's attendance is a concern, the school is here to support you in improving this. If you would like advice or support regarding your child's attendance, please do not hesitate to get in touch with us. We are always happy to help and work together to ensure the best outcomes for our children.


