



## Sports Premium 2025-26 Spending Plan

Funding to support Primary PE and School Sport. In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for physical education (PE) and sport. This funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision. Our school has been allocated **£19,630** for the academic year 2025-2026.

We will prioritise our PE and sport premium to improve in the following 5 key areas:

- 1: Increasing all staff's confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE and sport
- 2: Increasing engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity and sport
- 3: Raising the profile of PE and sport across the school, to support whole school improvement
- 4: Offering a broader and more equal experience of a range of sports and physical activities to all pupils
- 5: Increase participation in competitive sport

### **1. Increasing staff confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE and sport**

- Specialist sports coach employed to deliver PE curriculum £10,536
- Employ dance specialist to support teaching and learning developing staff skills £2,560
- Get Set 4PE online PE platform to support planning and assessment and provide high quality lessons £555

#### **Impact.**

- Increased pupil engagement due to structured, high-quality sessions that support progression and differentiated access.
- Raised profile of PE across the school by embedding specialist-led clubs and lunchtime activities.
- Expanded extracurricular offer, resulting in higher participation from targeted groups, including less active pupils.

### **2. Increasing engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity and sport.**

- Wheelchair Enrichment Day for KS2 children £1000

#### **Impact**

- more pupils accessing outdoor physical activity and play based activities.

### **3. Raising the profile of PE and sport across the school, to support whole school improvement**

To enhance inclusion and deepen understanding by embedding oracy within PE lessons, enabling all pupils to articulate strategies, rules, and techniques confidently using key vocabulary.

**Impact**

- Increased pupil engagement and participation across all ability levels.

**4. Offering a broader and more equal experience of a range of sports**

To introduce pupils to new and more unusual sports and activities, hoping to provide pupils with a lifelong love of sport and activity.

Sporting coach used to develop skills at lunchtime to develop purposeful play and enhance physical and teamwork skills. £10,536 (inclusive of after school/lunch time/events)

PE and Sports Equipment £ 2,354

**Intended Impact** 80% of all KS2 children participate in sport in the wider curriculum.

**To provide top up swimming lessons for Yr 4**

**Intended Impact** 90% of pupils in Year 6 achieve the national expectation for swimming. More pupils will enter the Catholic swimming gala and the Coventry swimming gala achieving a good competitive outcome. Increasing participation in competitive sport

Travel costs approx. £1,500

**5: Increase participation in competitive sport**

Participate in a range of competitive sports through Catholic leagues and sporting events and the School Games school events.
