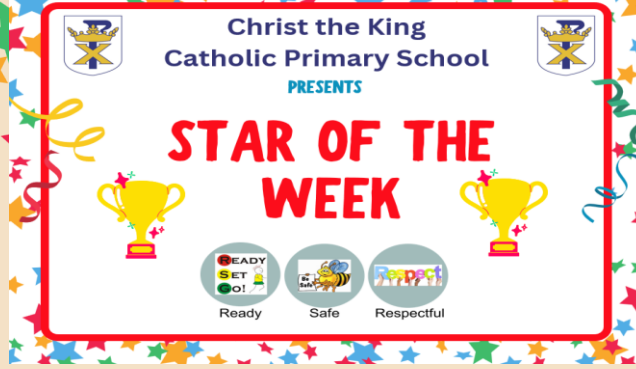
We encourage children to be creative... costumes can be simple, homemade, or something you already have at home.

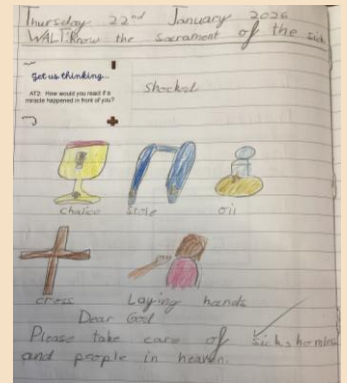

## YEAR TWO

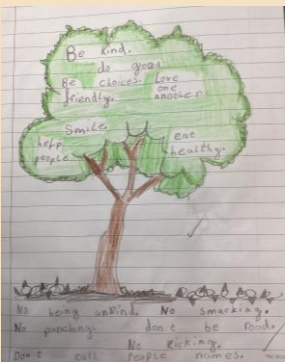
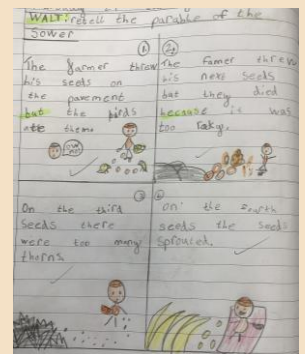
Year 2 have been busy deepening their understanding of Jesus' life and teachings. They explored several of Jesus' miracles, including The Wedding Feast at Cana, The Calming of the Storm, and The Healing of the Centurion, thinking about what these signs reveal about Jesus' love and power.

As part of our learning about The Sacrament of the Sick, Year 2 welcomed Deacon Keith, who kindly answered the children's questions about anointing the sick. He brought his oils and stole to show the children, helping them see how the Church cares for those who are unwell.



Year 2 then turned their attention to their own gifts and talents, discussing how they can use them to help others, just as Jesus taught.

Through Jesus' parables, Year 2 explored important messages about choices and kindness. They created a storyboard of the Parable of the Sower, read The Prodigal Son, and reflected on the difference between good and bad choices by drawing their own choice trees.



The class prayer service focused on the theme of Love, and it was wonderful to welcome so many parents to join us for a peaceful and meaningful morning. This week, Year 2 have begun their Lenten journey, learning about Ash Wednesday, forgiveness, and how we can grow closer to God during this special season.

## Safeguarding at CTK

With its end-to-end encryption and huge popularity, WhatsApp is often seen as a private and secure way to stay in touch; however, that same privacy can make it harder for trusted adults to see when things go wrong. This guide explains how features like group chats, disappearing messages, 'Channels' and location sharing can expose young users to pressure, unwanted contact and inappropriate content.

It also looks at emerging concerns such as scams, advertising and the in-app AI assistant, helping adults understand how these elements may affect children and young people. Alongside the risks, the guide offers practical advice to support meaningful conversations, encourage safer settings and build young users' confidence in navigating WhatsApp responsibly.

**Coventry Complex Communication Team will be delivering a series of 6 free workshop sessions aimed at parents and carers of children and young people on the Autism spectrum and with complex communication needs**

Each session will be delivered virtually through Microsoft Teams and presented by a specialist practitioner in the field of Autism and complex communication needs. There will be a series of sessions focusing on a range of topics, which include:

- **Week 1- Thursday 5th March 2026: Understanding your child and their Autism**
- **Week 2 – Thursday 12th March 2026: Supporting your child with self-care and independence**
- **Week 3 – Thursday 19th March 2026: Supporting your child and their sensory processing differences**
- **Week 4 – Thursday 26th March: Supporting your child and their behaviours**
- **Weeks 5 & 6 Supporting your child with their learning & Supporting your child with transitions** – these sessions will be in a recorded format and sent out to parents and carers due to the Easter holiday

**The aim of each session will be to:**

- To raise an awareness of how Autism/Complex Communication Needs can affect your child
- To develop a shared understanding of some of the challenges that our children face, and the strengths they can bring
- To increase your confidence in understanding and supporting your child
- To build up a bank of ideas and strategies that can be used to support your child

All sessions are 2.00pm-3.00pm. Whilst we appreciate you may not be able to attend every session due to work/family commitments; the expectation is that you **must** attend week one as this provides the foundation for the remaining sessions, and that you are able to commit to at least three of the following sessions. There are weekly advice clinics that accompany each session where you have an allocated slot to ask specific questions relating to your child.
