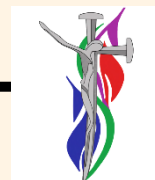

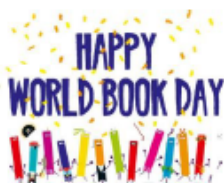

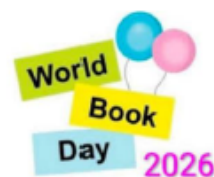
Think about: Why did you choose this book? What does it say about you? Which part of the book feels most like you?

This week, Art Club have enjoyed being outside sketching and painting in the sunshine. The children have been creating artwork linked to our Catholic Social Teaching principles.





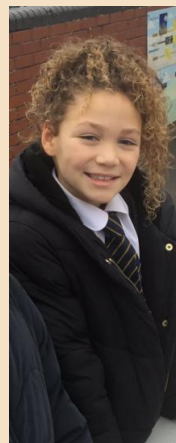
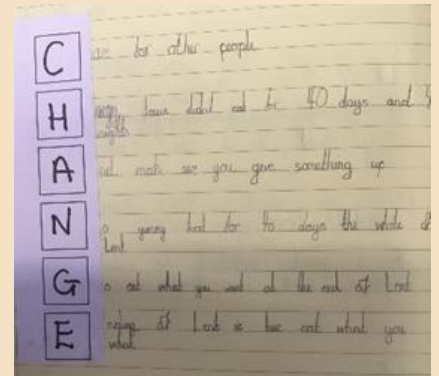

## YEAR THREE - OUR JOURNEY THROUGH LENT

Year 3 have been thoughtfully exploring the season of Lent. As part of our current unit, we have been learning about some of Jesus' miracles, including the Widow of Nain and the Healing of the Paralysed Man. Through these stories, we have reflected on how miracles change people's lives and why Jesus chose to perform them. We also discussed the qualities Jesus shows – such as compassion, love and forgiveness – and expressed our understanding by writing letters to Him.

We understand that Lent is a special time when Christians try to grow closer to God and become more like Christ. To demonstrate this, we created beautiful acrostic poems carefully choosing words that reflect this important season.

Lent is also a time of prayer, fasting and giving. The children have written their own Lenten Promises, thoughtfully considering what they would like to do during this season to grow in kindness and faith.



Now that they are in Year 3, the children are proud to take on more responsibility by running their own stall for Lenten Charities. They have enjoyed working together in house groups to help raise money and support those in need..

We are very proud of the maturity and reflection Year 3 have shown during this meaningful time in the Church's year.

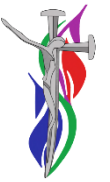

**10 Top Tips for Parents and Educators**  
**CREATIVE WAYS TO ENCOURAGE READING**

Reading regularly has a life-long impact, yet recent data from the National Literacy Trust shows a decline in reading for pleasure among 8- to 18-year-olds, with just 32.7% enjoying it in 2025. Despite growing distractions, there are practical ways adults can spark a love of reading. This guide offers strategies and resources to help inspire young readers.

- 1 VALUE ALL READING**  
When we think about reading, it's very easy to picture a young person reading a fictional novel; however, reading is so much more than this. To help them understand, why not show them how to create a 24-hour reading diary? Set down all reading and then discuss this with them. By doing this, you can demonstrate the many ways we turn to reading.
- 2 WIDEN THE SELECTION**  
Once we know reading can be varied, we need to think about the selection of reading material they can access. Visit a shop selling magazines, the library and a bookshop, and consider the range of material that is available within them. Then consider how you might broaden their reading choices, so all young people have access to a wide and varied selection.
- 3 GIFT A BOOK**  
One simple way to encourage reading is to make books feel special. Getting a book made value and shows it's something to be treasured. What if it is a reward for a celebration like a birthday, let the young person choose a title or pick one you know they enjoy. You could also include a personal note inside.
- 4 CONNECT WITH AUTHORS**  
Meeting authors can certainly spark an interest in their reading material. This might be through a live event in a school/bookshop or by using the wealth of online material that is now available. Encourage young people to look out ways to connect with authors using free resources such as Authorly and our Inspire's Children's Authors Live.
- 5 BUILD YOUR KNOWLEDGE**  
Access training about reading for pleasure to widen your understanding of this topic and, more importantly, how to develop it. Explore a wide range of free resources that can be found online. The more you know, the better placed you are to inspire a love of reading in others.
- 6 TALK BOOKS**  
There are times when we need advice to read and focus on our book; however, we know that reading is a social experience, so we must also factor in discussion time. Reading the same book gives two people a connection and the opportunity to voice their thoughts and questions about it. Why not buy two copies of a book and read it together? Start the connection.
- 7 RECOMMENDATIONS**  
As well as talking about the content of books, we can share what we are reading or have read recently. This can often act as a trigger for someone else to explore it. How often have you noticed a sign or seen someone else has recommended it? It's the same with books. If you know the young person well, you can follow their recommendations and show why you think they're enjoy it.
- 8 GO DIGITAL**  
With the rise in online digital material, we can easily focus on the negatives; however, it also brings a wealth of opportunities. Resources can not only enhance the reading experience for young people. They can read online with audiobooks, transcripts, and track their reading goals with resources like Poly and one-page like bookshelves for older children. Augmented reality books are bringing books to life and offer a great way for engagement.
- 9 RECONNECT**  
There can come a time when a love of reading seems to disappear. It does not mean it's gone forever. It generally means they have lost the connection. How do we get it back? Find the next piece of reading material that sparks their current interests. The National Year of Reading focus of all for captions that well do it in their key theme. As children grow and change, so do their interests. A visit to the local library is a great way to support the reconnection.
- 10 LEAD BY EXAMPLE**  
Let them see you reading. If you make time to read, you send a strong message to children reading matter. Show why you enjoy it. It is to relax, escape the world, learn something new or to understand it. When children see reading as a normal and valued part of everyday life, they are more likely to enjoy it themselves.
