Reading

- Children are expected to read to an adult at home four times a week.

Maths

- Teachers will set weekly tasks on Maths Flex.
- Weekly homework links to the learning in class while also offering personalised practice by supporting gaps in pupils' knowledge.

Maths

- Children in Year 6 are to complete Rising Stars Activities - please see additional homework sheet for pages and dates due.

Reading

- Children are expected to read at least four times a week to an adult and for an adult to sign their reading diary.
- Children will receive **one book at a time**.
- Reading diaries are expected to be in school every day.

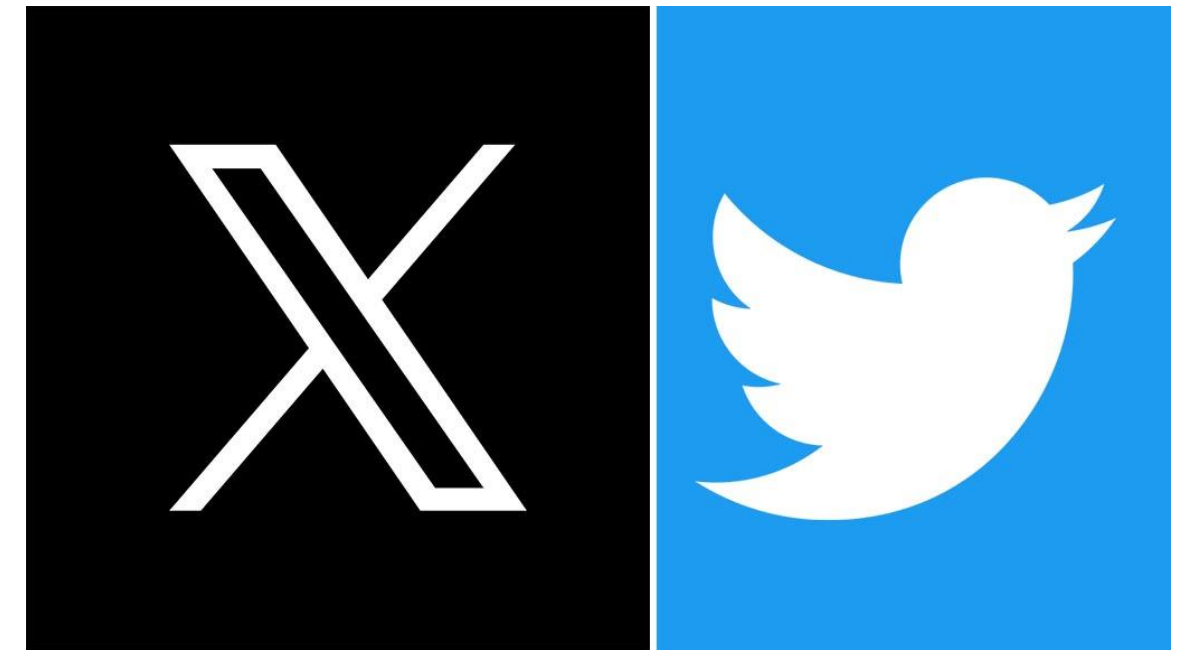

Year 6 – SATs

Statutory Testing

At the end of Year 6, children will sit tests in:

Date	Test paper
Monday 8 th May 2023	Spelling and Grammar (x2 papers)
Tuesday 9 th May 2023	Reading (x1 paper)
Wednesday 10 th May 2023	Arithmetic and Reasoning (x2 papers)
Thursday 11 th May 2023	Reasoning (x1 paper)

These tests will be both set and marked externally, and the results will be used to measure your child's progress and the school's performance.

Year 6 – SATs

Statutory Testing

GPS

The grammar, punctuation and spelling test will consist of two parts:

- **Grammar and punctuation paper** requiring short answers (45 minutes)
 - **Spelling test of 20 words** (approx. 15 minutes)

READING

Your child will have **one hour**, including reading time, to complete the test.

No prompts are allowed from an adult.

Maths

Children will sit three papers in maths:

- Paper 1: **arithmetic (30 minutes)**
- Papers 2 and 3: **mathematical fluency, solving problems and reasoning (40 minutes per paper)**

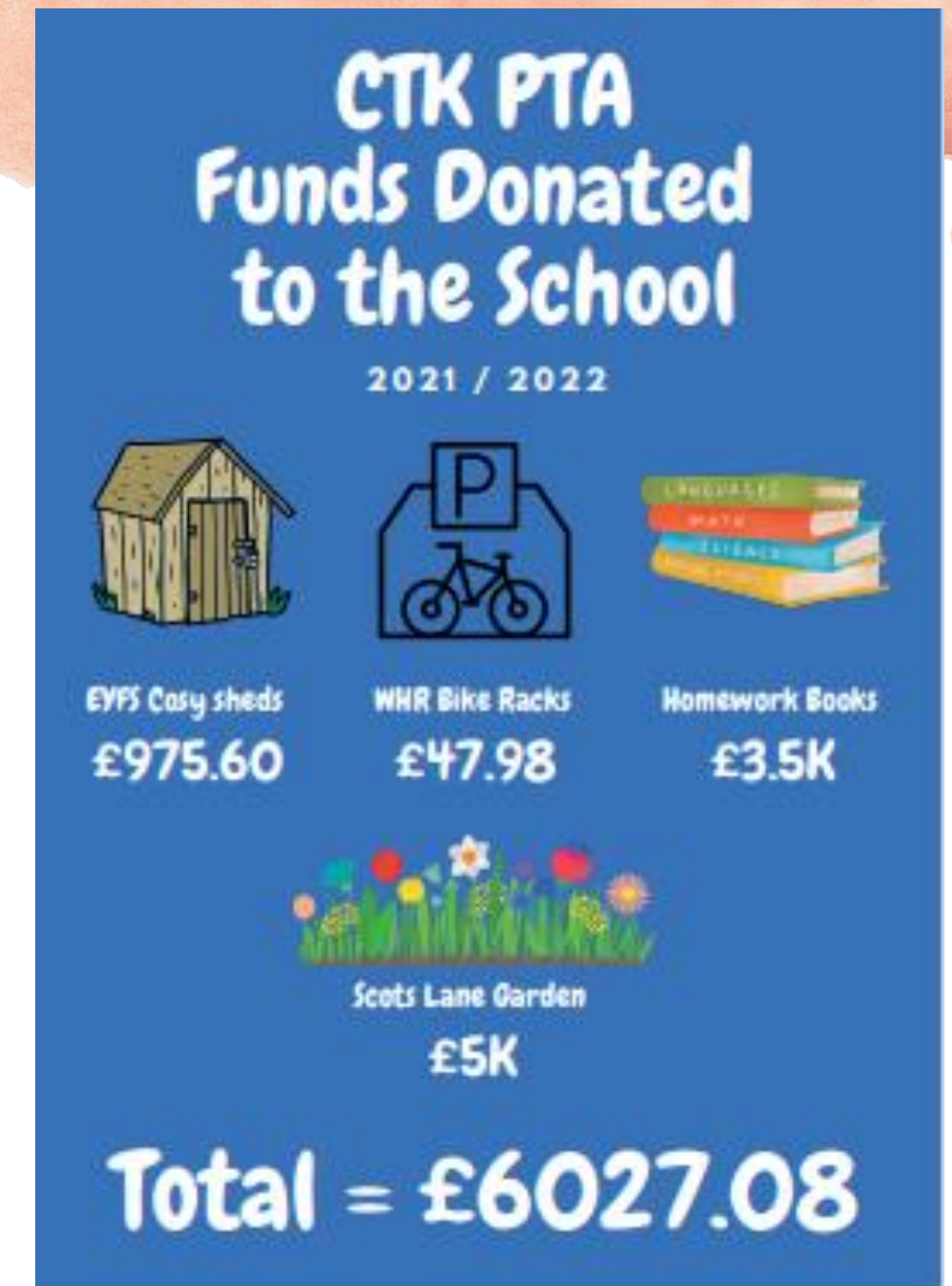

Plas Dol-y-Moch

26th November – 30th November

Situated in the Snowdonia National Park between the mountain and the sea, Plas Dol-y-Moch is a large 17th century country house set in gardens and woodlands in the Vale of Ffestiniog, and it **has been Coventry's outdoor education centre since 1966.**

It is an ideal base for adventure activities and field work with all activities close at hand and easily reached in the Centre's fleet of four minibuses. **All tutorial staff are highly qualified teachers of outdoor education and work closely with Coventry schools to design and deliver courses.**



Plas Dol-y-Moch

A packing list will be shared for the trip closer to the time. All children will be provided with walking boots, a waterproof coat and jacket, a fleece, a windproof jacket, a rucksack and water bottle. They'll also be provided with equipment for completing the activities. Therefore, you will not need to buy any specialist equipment or walking boots – DYM staff insist children wear their walking boots and waterproofs.



Confirmation

Dates for Confirmation have not yet been booked by the Church. We will be in touch once these are released. There will be two meetings held at Church for parents detailing the preparation for Confirmation. Children will also attend a Commitment Mass as part of their preparation. The dates for these will be shared once we have them.

Children will all receive a Mass Book to prepare them for their Sacrament. The Church asks that children attend Mass each week to listen to the Gospel, complete the work in their book and have it signed by a priest or deacon. These can be signed by another priest or deacon if you attend a different church as the whole diocese are using these books. We ask that your child brings their book to school each Monday.

Reading at Mass: Year 6 children will be asked to read at the 9am Mass on a Sunday twice a month. Please look out in the school newsletter when it is the children leading. We will be in touch if your child is reading at Mass. If they are not reading, the church and school would really appreciate their support in the choir loft.
